### **Curriculum** planning

This month we are beginning a curriculum planning focus on Self Help and Independence skills related to hygiene, dressing, self care, food preparation and grace and courtesy skills. With the Winter season now upon us we felt it very appropriate to revisit hygiene awareness and practices first. We have so far focused on safe and hygienic nose blowing and hand washing. We have also been working further on our table manners in handling and sharing of food during our kai time, as well as related manners including using cutlery, holding, and eating food and expected behaviour at a shared table. Our children are developing and displaying wonderful practices in these areas, which builds their self esteem, confidence and mana. Older children also support younger children daily in this areas, in a tuakana/ teina relationship and are excellent at role modelling. Ka pai tamariki!







Our Little Scientist programme has begun! Our first weekly session with teachers Jess and Jean was all about Goo! Children were amazing with how their mixtures resulted in transformations into goop, goo, slime and sludge. This educational and hands on programme will teach our children about various areas of science through experimentation and play.







We are continuing to develop our physical skills during our **Playball** sessions where each week children are guided through a game based physical education programme to learn to move confidently and gain control over their bodies. Each session we see children challenge themselves physically whilst having fun and exploring their capabilities.





This month we celebrated Samoan Language Week. Teachers introduced the Samoan flag to children, and highlighted the geographical and cultural features of Samoa. We listened to songs in Samoan language and practiced greetings with each other.
